Air quality newsflash

Change your journey, change your country



To learn how active travel can have a positive impact on the country.

To write a report/ newsflash script on why active travel is important.



Get pupils to brainstorm how active travel can benefit the whole country.

Encourage pupils to write a report/script on how active travel can benefit the country. They can use their worksheet for help on how to write a report or adapt the example given. Pupils have the option to turn their report/script into a newsflash about active travel. See the extension for more information.



Pupils can now turn their report into a newsflash.

Allocate 10 minutes for pupils to practice their newsflash and find any props needed.

Each pupil/group in turn presents their newsflash.

Ask pupils to provide constructive feedback on each newsflash.

Optional – film pupils newsflashes and share on social media to spread the message on the importance of active travel.



If pupils are unable to write a report on the benefits of active travel discuss as a class what air pollution is, what causes it and what can be done to reduce it.

You can use these five points to help you write a report

- What is the story?
- Why is the story important? How can you get the audience's interest?
- Who is the audience.
- Where remember you are talking about an issue that is impacting the whole country.
- When make sure you talk about the importance of the topic NOW!



Example report script

Hello, this is an important news flash!

Pollution is affecting the air we breathe and is causing climate change.
